



A Palm Beach County native, Alexcia Cox returned after graduating from law school and began her career prosecuting domestic violence cases in the Office of the State Attorney for Florida's Fifteenth Judicial Circuit in Palm Beach County. As a domestic violence prosecutor, Alexcia has successfully prosecuted cases ranging from simple domestic battery to first-degree murder. In 2009, Alexcia was the first attorney chosen to launch the Felony Domestic Violence Unit at the Office of the State Attorney. In 2012, she was promoted to unit chief and oversaw all aspects of case management related to the prosecution of misdemeanor and felony domestic violence cases as well as the supervision attorneys assigned to the unit. Under her leadership, there was an increase in successful domestic violence prosecutions. She was also instrumental in the development and implementation of a new program geared toward educating both victims and the accused following a first-time incident of violence. This program aims to equip victims with knowledge and resources to reduce the likelihood of a second incident of violence. Today, Alexcia serves as Deputy Chief Assistant to State Attorney Dave Aronberg and supervises prosecutors assigned to the County Court (misdemeanor) Division, Domestic Violence Unit, Conviction Review Unit and the North and South County satellite offices. As a passionate domestic violence prosecutor and influential leader, Alexcia uses her voice to educate the community about domestic violence and resources available to victims.

Alexcia is actively involved in several professional and civic organizations. She currently serves on the board of directors for the Palm Beach County Chapter of the Florida Association for Women Lawyers and is a member of the Florida Bar Standing Committee on Professionalism, the National Black Prosecutors Association, the National Bar Association, the F. Malcom Cunningham, Sr. Bar Association, the Craig S. Barnard Inn of Court, the Palm Beach County Bar Association's Professionalism Committee, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, and Leadership Florida Cornerstone Class 39. Additionally, Alexcia served as past board president of the YWCA of Palm Beach County which offers counseling, emergency shelter and transitional housing for victims of domestic violence. Most recently, Alexcia joined the

West Palm Beach Mayor's Task Force for Racial and Ethnic Equality where she serves as co-chair of the Criminal Justice Subcommittee.

Alexcia is an honors graduate of both the University of Central Florida and the Florida State University College of Law. In 2019, she received the prestigious Justice Barbara Pariente Award for her commitment to promoting women in the Palm Beach County legal community and was named "Trailblazer of the Year" by Legacy South Florida Magazine.
